
Environmental and Social Management System







Plan Development Goals

- »» Resonates with Native Hawaiian community










- **Goals / Desired Outcomes**


We honor the spiritual and cultural significance of Papahānaumokuākea, revitalize the ancestral connections between Native Hawaiians and this sacred region, and increase mana.

- **Goals / Desired Outcomes**


Pono management of Papahānaumokuākea is based on the foundation of both indigenous and scientific knowledge. Research findings generate mana, honor ancestors, and help sustain people and knowledge systems.

- **Goals / Desired Outcomes**


Native Hawaiian traditional values, knowledge and management concepts are systematically integrated into the overall Monument management through activities that increase cultural knowledge and proficiency and support culturally appropriate policies and operations.

- **Goals / Desired Outcomes**


Partnerships are developed to empower Native Hawaiians, raise constituent awareness and knowledge, and increase support for the management of resources within Papahānaumokuākea.
